<p>Learning objectives At the end of the course students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand the distinctive lexical, morphosyntactic, textual and rhetorical language features in specialised texts in Catalan on a wide range of subject areas. • Produce correct specialised texts on a wide range of subject areas.
